Another part of the beauty of Spring is how it is celebrated around the world. I thought I would share some interesting and little-known traditions. I hope the thought of these celebrations makes you smile.

Thailand – Songkran Water Festival: Locals and tourists alike take to the streets, equipped with cannon-sized water guns, pressure hoses and buckets, ready to drench anyone in their path. Children, adults, and the elderly take part in the tradition, dancing in the streets to loud music.

Northern India – Holi: It involves throwing colored powder at one another, which pays tribute to the many hues of the spring season as well as events from Hindu mythology.

Gloucester, England – Cooper's Hill Cheese Rolling: It's a lot more dangerous than the name would lead you to believe. A wheel of cheese is thrown down the very steep hill and one second later competitors throw themselves down after it. The first one to cross the finish line wins. Bruises, bloodied knees, and broken bones aren't uncommon side-effects of this intense tradition. A slightly rougher way to welcome Spring.

Bosnia – Cimburijada: At the crack of dawn, people gather by the banks of the Bosna river, where a communal meal of scrambled eggs is prepared. Together, people share their breakfast eggs with friends, families, and visitors while drinking and listening to music together to mark the first day of spring.

Mexico – Spring Equinox in Teotihuacan: Thousands of people, traditionally dressed in white, gather at the Teotihuacán Pyramid to climb the 360 steps to the top of the Pyramid where they raise their arms towards the sky and bask in the sun's warmth as they "soak up" energy for the year.

NAEOP Professional Standards Program (PSP) - Katherine Reichley, CEOE

All NAEOP members are eligible to participate in the Professional Standards Program (PSP) which recognizes people for their work experience, education and in-service credits, and participation in associations. At the minimum, you need the following:



- Four years of work experience, two must be in an educational institution or educational affiliated institution
- Education and in-service training measured either in clock hours or by degrees; if you have 210 hours, you can apply – no college courses required
- Association responsibility or participation points which are based on professional memberships, committee participation, and leadership roles


