In the best of times, open, honest communication between and among people is challenging. We are concerned that our views will be misunderstood, unpopular, or offensive. So, we choose not to share some of our authentic thoughts and feelings. And while we are mentally editing what we are about to share, we fail to really listen to the ideas, concerns, and evolutionary thinking of others.

And let's face it, we are not living in the best of times. Our daily lives contain a variety of situations that are uncomfortable, stressful, and even confrontational. The diversity among us is often divisive rather celebrated. As a result, we spend more time and energy excluding people and experiences that could enrich our lives. Let's stop stunting our growth!

Tough Talk with Tender Tongues is a paradigm shift in our thinking about public discourse. Nothing is off limits for discussion. And since we know we will not always agree or be comfortable during our dialogues, let us practice engaging in them more effectively. This session will provide you with tips for exploring your own thoughts and feelings and how to express them authentically with others.

Dr. Rebecca Lee Parker has a passion and talent for engaging in conversation, dialogue, and debate with the goal of increasing knowledge, understanding, and insight. Over the past 40 years, she has engaged in a diversity of rich experiences with a variety of people, cultures, groups, and organizations, including churches, non-profits, education, and business.

In addition to numerous recognitions, she received during her tenures at The Ohio State University and JP Morgan Chase, Dr. Parker has also been recognized for her community work in Columbus, Ohio, and her national contributions in higher education. Her dissertation, Understanding the Collegiate Experience of African :American Students Living in an Ethnic Enclave on a Predominately White Campus, was used as a thought piece to generate discussion about the controversial choices minorities make to survive and thrive in our culture.

A passionate lifelong learner Dr. Parker is known for her energetic presence and dedication to meaningful, community-based impact. With a rich background in education and training, she continues to inspire through writing, presentations, and mentoring. Her strength lies in making complex ideas accessible and actionable, and she remains committed to supporting the growth and success of others through effective communication and connection.
